IN THIS ISSUE



This edition of the Bashir Region Newsletter highlights some of the key activities and initiatives that have taken place across the region between November 2025 and February 2026. Over the past few months, Khuddam have remained actively engaged in strengthening their faith, serving their communities and building stronger bonds of brotherhood.

Inside this issue, readers will find highlights from a range of regional activities including community service initiatives, spiritual programmes and gatherings that have brought Khuddam together from across different Qiadats. These efforts reflect the continued commitment of Khuddam to serve the Jama'at and wider society.

As Bashir Region continues through the Khuddam year, many more programmes and initiatives are planned, with the aim of further strengthening participation, brotherhood and service within the Majlis.

**ISHA'AT DEPARTMENT
BASHIR REGION**

November

November marked the start of the new Khuddam year for Bashir Region, with the formation of the Regional Amila 2025–26 and an early focus on setting standards of Tarbiyyat, coordination and service. The Regional Qaid and Motamid reminded office bearers to seek prayers through letters to Huzoor (aba), and the region began the year with the intention of working with unity and discipline.

A key regional highlight came on 16 November, when Khuddam from the region alongside members of the Bashir Regional Amila offered Fajr behind Hazrat Khalifatul Masih (aba) at Islamabad. Following the prayer, Khuddam also benefited from an informal sitting with Sadr Majlis Khuddamul Ahmadiyya UK, making it a memorable morning of spiritual uplift and motivation. After Fajr, Bashir Region held a friendly cricket match against the National Amila. The game ended in a draw, but Bashir Region secured victory in the Super Over, adding a moment of brotherhood and positive energy to the day. Later in the month, the region held its first Regional Amila meeting in person (21 November), helping establish priorities for the year ahead and strengthening coordination between departments and Qiadats. Alongside planning, Bashir Region also contributed to national initiatives, including participation in National Waqar-e-Amal (21 November), and preparation for further service requirements linked to activities at Islamabad and Aiwan-e-Mahmood.

In terms of regional engagement, Bashir Region announced and promoted the Inter-Qiadat FIFA Tournament (28 November at Aiwan-e-Mahmood), designed to bring Khuddam and older Atfal together in a relaxed environment of teamwork, congregational prayer and brotherhood.

The month closed with strong community-facing work. On 30 November, Khuddam from Walton-on-Thames joined forces with Elmbridge Borough Council for a tree planting initiative in Molesey, attended by the Mayor of Elmbridge and local dignitaries. This was a valuable opportunity to serve the wider community while reflecting the true spirit of Khuddam: service, discipline and positive representation.

Overall, November provided a solid foundation for the year ahead—combining spiritual moments at Islamabad, early organisational planning, regional brotherhood activities, and practical service to the community.

December combined spiritual programmes, regional planning and outreach activity across Bashir Region. The “Pearls of Wisdom” weekly sessions launched, focusing on Qur’an tafsir and structured reading from the writings of the Promised Messiah (as), to strengthen learning and consistency.

A key highlight was the Regional Office Bearers Forum (13 December, Islamabad), beginning with Fajr behind Huzoor (aba) and followed by departmental presentations setting out plans and priorities for the year ahead. Walton-on-Thames hosted the “How to Be Free from Sin” tarbiyyat programme with strong engagement and discussion, while Oxford Qiadat carried out a Tabligh leafleting session in Swindon. Reading Qiadat also organised a Fajr and hike programme to build brotherhood and activity.

The month closed with wider Jama’at engagement, including viewing the Jalsa Salana Qadian 2025 concluding address, keeping the region connected to Khilafat and focused going into the new year.





January focused on service, community engagement and spiritual development across Bashir Region.

The month began with the New Year Street Clean Up, organised across Oxford, Walton-on-Thames, Reading and Guildford, where 62 participants collected 19 bags of litter, demonstrating Khuddam's commitment to serving their local communities.

A notable outreach activity also took place on 24 January, when Reading Khuddam and Atfal visited Dashwood Manor Care Home in Basingstoke. During the visit, Atfal distributed flowers to residents and fruit baskets were presented for approximately 70 residents, bringing joy and companionship to the elderly community.

The region also supported Jama'at service requirements through manpower provided for the International Waqf-e-Nau Conference at Islamabad, contributing significant volunteer hours over the weekend.

Towards the end of the month, the region participated in Salat Habit Week (26 January – 1 February), encouraging Khuddam across the Qiadats to strengthen their connection with prayer through regular attendance and reporting.

The month began with MKA Reading, which held its Local Ijtema on Sunday 1 February 2026. This was followed by MKA Walton-on-Thames on Saturday 14 February, while MKA Guildford and MKA Oxford both held their Ijtemas on Sunday 15 February 2026. Each event brought together Khuddam and Atfal from their respective Jama'ats, creating an atmosphere of enthusiasm and healthy competition.

Across the region, the Ijtemas featured a wide range of academic and sporting competitions, including Tilawat, Nazm, prepared speech, religious knowledge quizzes, and various sports activities. These competitions provided Khuddam and Atfal with an opportunity to showcase their talents while strengthening their understanding of faith and Islamic values.

Beyond the competitions, the Ijtemas also served as an opportunity for tarbiyyat and unity, with opening and closing sessions emphasising the importance of service, discipline, and dedication to the Jama'at. Many of the programmes included motivational remarks from local leadership, reflections on the purpose of Khuddamul Ahmadiyya, and encouragement for members to remain active in Majlis activities throughout the year.

Overall, the Local Ijtemas across Bashir Region were well organised, well attended, and highly successful, highlighting the dedication of local Amila teams and volunteers. The events strengthened brotherhood among Khuddam and Atfal and helped set a positive tone for continued activities across the region in the months ahead.
